Glyndwr is a 200 year old stone built Welsh miner's cottage located in the ancient village of Beddgelert, which nestles in the heart of the Snowdonia National Park - one of Britain's best loved areas of natural beauty. The village is a conservation area and the cottage has recently been Grade 2 listed, to protect its heritage. The region offers outstanding opportunities for walking, climbing, touring or just sitting on the miles of flat sandy beach at nearby Black Rock Sands. The peak of Snowdon itself is visible within a few minutes drive although it takes a little longer to reach it on foot for the more adventurous! The surrounding area is rich with rugged mountains, lakes, rivers and lush valleys. Hillside farms and quaint villages provide a tranquil backdrop for a most relaxing holiday.



Glyndwr offers a lounge with dining area on the ground floor. The beamed ceiling and stone fireplace add charming character to this traditional cottage. There is a



colour TV / video in the lounge. There are two sofas and an armchair. The dining table seats six. A newly fitted kitchen has a double oven cooker, microwave, washer / dryer and fridge with ice box. Upstairs there is a double bedroom at the front looking out towards the river Glaslyn and at the rear is a second bedroom with twin bunks and a single divan. There is adequate wardrobe and cupboard space. Through the

second bedroom is a small room with a couch and various books and toys for children to play with. The shower room and toilet has continuous hot water served by a water heater in the airing cupboard. The cottage is heated by electric storage radiators and there is a separate electric fire in the lounge. All electricity costs are included in the rental. The beds all have duvets and linen is provided. Customers are requested to bring their own towels and tea towels.

There is a small sloping garden at the rear with a timber deck and barbeque, access is by steps from the kitchen and from the rear bedroom.



Beddgelert and surroundings

The village of Beddgelert has gained ten awards in recent years for Wales, Britain and Europe in Bloom. It has shops, cafes and five country pubs or hotels offering a wide choice of facilities for eating out.

The old stone bridge in the centre of the village is a regular meeting place for locals and from it you can see the Colywn and Glaslyn rivers join to flow down

the spectacular Aberglaslyn Pass and on to the sea. A walk down the pass allows you to follow the low path - 'the fisherman's walk' which hugs the river, or the bed

of the old welsh mountain railway, although the three tunnels originally blasted out and cleared by hand to construct the narrow gauge railway serving the local copper mine at Sygun, are temporarily closed for the construction of a new narrow gauge railway. This mine, just a mile outside the village, is open to the public and makes an interesting trip out. The nearest town of Portmadog is eight miles away and has a larger selection of shops. Caernarvon and

Bangor are forty minutes drive away, providing busier town atmospheres.



How to book and what to pay

For 2008 we are leaving the rate you pay entirely up to you!

The reason is that the amount you pay will be donated to Crawley Baptist Church's 125th Anniversary fund to help pay off the outstanding debt on the church

If you have no idea what to pay, the following rates are typical rates per week for similar cottages in the area: Autumn and Spring £320, Spring weeks with a Bank Holiday in them £350, early and late Summer £435 and in the school summer holiday £545. The cottage sleeps up to five adults (no extra per person).. We provide free of charge to visitors:

- the cost of electricity, including heating
- bed linen.



The only thing we ask you to do is clean the cottage thoroughly before leaving so it is clean for the next visitor (there is no additional cleaning service).
